The First Christmas

Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the city of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and family of David, in order to register along with Mary, who was engaged to him, and was with child. Luke 2:4-5

Meet Mary of Nazareth

*Greek name was Maria [M α pí α , M α pi $\dot{\alpha}$ μ] *Hebrew name was Miryam [מָרֵיָם]; named after the elder sister of **Moses and Aaron** *As a young teenager, she was betrothed (Hebrew erusin אירוסין) to Joseph *Like all Jewish people, she was waiting for the promised Messiah *She is described as a "virgin" in Luke 1:27 *She is called "favored one" of the Lord in Luke 1:28 *The angel Gabriel said "the Lord is with you" in Luke 1:28

Meet Joseph of Nazareth

*He is betrothed to and later husband of Mary (Matthew 1:18) *He is called a "righteous man" in Matthew 1:19 *He was by trade a carpenter or craftsman (Matthew 13:55) *Carpenter = τέκτων *tektōn* in New Testament Greek Definition: a worker in wood, a carpenter, joiner, builder; a ship's carpenter or builder; any craftsman, or stone workman



The Gospels do not specify whether Mary and Joseph walked or used a donkey for transportation. The Protoevangelium of James, an apocryphal Gospel probably written about AD 145, says that Joseph used a donkey to bring Mary to Bethlehem.

Did Mary and Joseph know the Messianic Prophecies? But as for you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, too little to be among the clans of Judah, from you One will go forth for Me to be ruler in Israel. His goings forth are from long ago, from the days of eternity. Micah 5:2 *written about 700 B.C.

Messiah Arrives

While they were there (in Bethlehem), the days were completed for her to give birth. And she (Mary) gave birth to her firstborn son; and she wrapped Him in cloths, and laid Him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn. Luke 2:6-7

The manger most likely was made of stone, not wood. The manger was simply a feeding trough. Amazingly, this served as Jesus' first bed following His miraculous birth. Throughout Israel, stone feeding troughs have been discovered by the 100s. While we don't expect anything made of wood to be preserved, stone feeding troughs can be still seen at places like Megiddo and Bethlehem.

In the 4th century AD, Emperor Constantine erected a basilica over a cave in Bethlehem believed to be Jesus' birthplace, and this basilica evolved into the present Church of the Nativity. – Harper's Bible Dictionary
