

Where it all begins

Genesis 1

Unlike men who struggle to find the meaning of life within the limits of the physical universe, we seek meaning by looking beyond material things to the Person of the Creator.

Teacher's Commentary

Who made all this?

- Creation was the voluntary choice of a sovereign, eternal God
- Part of the meaning of mankind being created in God's image (imago dei) is that we have choice
- God created the physical realm and the spiritual realm, He is beyond all those things
- The first verse in the Bible is a fork in the road -- a path with a belief in an all-powerful God or a path of depending upon a series of cosmic accidents
- Verb "bara" (created) is used only of God in the Bible. When people create something (poem, art) another verb is used. This verb applies to creation "ex nihilo" (something from nothing).

- Genesis 1 affirms God, a Person with mind and emotion and the power of choice, who existed before the beginning. The ultimate reality is not random motion in dead, impersonal matter. The ultimate reality is a living, vital, personal Being. Life, not death, is the eternal ground of all that is.
- You and I can find no meaning in a life which has roots in the chance interplay of mindless atoms. But we can find meaning when we realize that our lives were given us by another living personality. If God exists, and God is the cause of the material world, then we can look for meaning in His purposes in creating.
- "In the beginning God created." Here we find a special sense of comfort and joy. God did act, freely and from His own choice, to create. There is meaning to the universe, and a purpose to human life.
- "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth." God stands behind it all. The God of Genesis is no potter who merely shaped an already existing clay. The living God does not share His eternity with rock, or even with the billion stars that span our sky. The Source of all, the only and the ultimate reality, is God.

 Teacher's Commentary

Who made all this? Scripture says....

- For behold, He who forms mountains and creates the wind and declares to man what are His thoughts, He who makes dawn into darkness and treads on the high places of the earth, the Lord God of hosts is His name. Amos 4:13
- For thus says the Lord, who created the heavens (He is the God who formed the earth and made it, He established it and did not create it a waste place, but formed it to be inhabited), "I am the Lord, and there is none else." Isaiah 45:18
- The heavens are telling of the glory of God; and their expanse is declaring the work of His hands. Psalm 19:1
- Let the glory of the Lord endure forever; let the Lord be glad in His works; Psalm 104:31

Who made all this?

- The material and moral world were designed by a Person, who made mankind distinct from the rest of Creation. There is no hint here of the pagan notion that objects (like the sun or moon) are "gods." There is no hint of the modern fiction that life was generated spontaneously from nonliving matter, to gradually evolve from single cells into the complex forms we know today. Genesis sets forth a personal God as the ultimate reality. He is the root and source of all that exists.
- Everything around us has been carefully and thoughtfully designed. Creation is a mirror, placed to reflect our thoughts and our worship back to the Person whose image Creation enables us to see.
- Creation is such compelling proof of God's existence, and such a clear reflection of His character, that any explanation of beginnings which rules God out serves only to underline human perversity.
- Today, as in the ancient world, the urge persists to find some explanation for man and the universe, but an explanation which leaves out God.

Origin of the universe and our solar system

Grade 9

Science

Out of the Big Bang came everything in the Universe. All of the matter that formed Earth, all of the materials that formed the stars and galaxies that light up the night sky, and all of the building blocks for everything in the Universe were once contained in a tiny singularity. Through observations of models, in this unit students will develop an understanding of evidence (cosmic background radiation and red shift) that has led scientists to their current understanding of the Universe's origin.

Is our culture teaching the next generation Light or Darkness?

- Sun and moon were created on day 4. So what is this light? God created spiritual light which counters the darkness mentioned in the previous verse. God's light allows the physical world (including man) to connect to the spiritual.

What is Light in science?



- There has been light from the beginning. Light travels at 186,282 miles per second.
- In all its forms—visible and invisible—it saturates the universe.
- Light is light—pure, but not simple. No one is exactly sure how to describe it. A wave? A particle? Yes, the scientists say. Both.
- It is a measure of light's importance in our daily lives that we hardly pay any attention to it. Light is almost like air. It's a given. A human would no more linger over the concept of light than a fish would ponder the notion of water.
- There are exceptions, certain moments of sudden appreciation when a particular manifestation of light,
 a transitory glory, appears—a rainbow, a sunset, a pulse of heat lightning in a dark sky, the shimmering
 surface of the sea at twilight, the little red dot from a professor's laser pointer. Stained glass in a church,
 backlit by a bright sky. The flashlight searching for the circuit breakers after a power outage.
- Usually, though, we don't see light, we merely see with it. You can't appreciate the beauty of a rose if
 you ponder that the color red is just the brain's interpretation of a specific wavelength of light with
 crests that are roughly 700 nanometers apart.
- The more you look at the topic, the more you realize that ours lives are built around light, that our daily
 existence is continuously shaped—and made vivid—by that ambiguous stuff that dates from the
 beginning of time. From our technology to our spiritually, we are creatures of light.


What is Light in science?



- Light is produced by changes in the energy level of electrons. Light moves through space as a wave, but when it encounters matter it behaves like a particle. It simply doesn't fit into one of our neat little categories. "Light, indeed, is different from anything else we know," writes physicist Sidney Perkowitz.
- Our eyes each have about 125 million rods and cones—specialized cells so sensitive that some can
 detect a mere handful of photons. "About one-fifth of your brain does nothing but try to deal with the
 visual world around you," says Perkowitz. The position of the eyes, semiprotected in the case of the skull
 close to the brain, is testament to the importance of visual data.
- The sky is blue because the molecules in the air scatter blue light more readily than they scatter red, orange, yellow, and green.
- Technology constantly advances, allowing engineers to create ever brighter beams. The general rule is that brightness has increased a hundredfold every five years.
- "You can envision a point where everyone in the world could have his own wavelength," says George Gilder. "You'd have one wavelength that connected you to the person you wanted to address in Vienna or Tokyo or Tierra del Fuego, and this wavelength could easily accommodate three dimensional images. You could have conversations in which you forget within literally seconds that the person is not present. You see a face, the images saturates your own optical capabilities." He adds, "I believe that light was made by God for communications."

In our physical world, how is light good?

Uses of Light today include:

- **1.Food formation** (photosynthesis; Light is the sole source of food generation for all living organisms)
- 2. Growth of the body
- 3. Regulation of physiology
- 4. Vision and sight
- **5.Temperature** (Light is a form of energy. Sunlight has huge energy by which the temperature on the earth is maintained. Due to this, life exists on earth.)
- 6.Sleep regulation (body clock or circadian rhythm)

Uses of Light today include:

- 7. Drying and evaporation (Sunlight helps dry the soil, forests, air and rocky surfaces due to its ability to heat up. It helps water evaporate from oceans and water ponds creating the water cycle.)
- 8. Sanitation of earth (Sunlight helps keep nature clean)
- 9. Source of electric energy (solar power)
- 10. For chemical analysis by spectroscopy (analysis of compounds)
- 11. Signal system (we use light as traffic signals, navigation signals, etc.)
- **12. Sterilization** (ultraviolet light is an excellent sterilizing agent in hospitals and stores)

As complex as Light is, as many possible uses of Light as there are... we only have Light because the Creator God said so.



The Hebrew word for "day" covers a variety of periods: the hours of daylight (Genesis 29:7), a twenty-four-hour day (Genesis 7:4) or an indefinite period (Genesis 35:3).

If this is the beginning, what will the end look like?
