


The phrase "Tower of Babel" does not appear in the Bible; it is always "the city and the tower."















Plain of Shinar - a district of Babylonia in southern Iraq which included Babel (Babylon), Erech (Warka), and Accad or in central Mesopotamia close to modern Baghdad.











A ziggurat, a pyramid-like structure made of mudbrick (Genesis 11:3), often had ties with pagan religions such as those of the Babylonians and Marduk. The construction of the Tower of Babel likely occurred in 2200s BC, but ziggurat structures started around 3,000 BC.





Did You Know?

Variations on the idea of a tower of Babel and/or confusion of languages can be found in such far-flung places as Korea, Mexico, Kenya, Estonia, Guatemala, Greece, Myanmar, Armenia, Polynesia and Alaska, just to name a few. These cultures join with those ancient Middle Eastern traditions held by the Sumerians, Assyrians, Chaldeans, Syro-Phoenicians and Hebrews.




























The Penalty for Pride

A brief glimpse of the future

They were amazed and astonished, saying, "Why, are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we each hear them in our own language to which we were born? Parthians and Medes and Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the districts of Libya around Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs—we hear them in our own tongues speaking of the mighty deeds of God." The Tower of Babel In Our Day?

Rabbi Naphtali Tzvi Yehuda Berlin (1816-1893) explained that they were the first social engineers—hoping to create a utopian society where all lived and thought as one. They feared that if some people would settle their own colonies and towns, they would develop their own cultures and unique modes of living. They wanted everyone to live in one controlled environment where they would be able to make sure that all remain culturally homogenous. The tower served as a base around which all people of their planned colony would settle no one leaving its immediate environs. The problem with their plan was that it was the first step toward a tyrannical state where no individual expression would be tolerated, and God split them into separate nations.
