
HAPPY ANNIVERSARY!

On Saturday, October 18, 1884, the Baptist Church of Christ at Melissa was organized by Pastor Levi Dunn and 22 charter members.

In October 1884...

- Mark Twain had just written


 The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn.

- Ringling Brothers circus had just premiered in May.






Map of Collin County, Texas in 1881

- A deadly tornado struck Melissa on April 13, 1921, killing 13 people and injuring many more. The tornado tore the roof off of the brick school building, but the children inside were not seriously injured. All churches in the town, three cotton gins, every business house except a bank, the post office, and the Houston and Texas Central railway station, were wrecked. The Waldon Hotel was lifted by the winds, turned halfway around, and thrown up against the school building.
- Eight years later, on August 8, 1929, a fire burned down many of the buildings that had been rebuilt after the tornado. Population declined from a high of 500 in 1925 down to 285 in 1949.





In the 137-year history of First Melissa, 37 different men have served as the church's senior pastor and spiritual leader.



- In 1884, the first deacon was J. M. Graves, F. H. Ogilvie was the first church clerk, and J. S. Hill was the first church treasurer.
- Worship services were held one Sunday per month from 1884 to 1898.
- In December 1886, the church selected a site on which to build, on the south end of the F. H. Ogilvie lot. Services led by Pastor William Dunn.
- By 1887, missions funds were being sent to Home Missions and Buckner Orphans Home. Records show gifts of \$5.00 to Home Missions and \$11.00 to the orphans home were sent that year.
- Church's first building was dedicated debt-free in March, 1890.
- Name of the Baptist Church of Christ at Melissa was changed in December, 1891. The church became known at that time as Melissa Baptist Church. Services were led by Pastor John W. Connelly. $_{WORDS\ OF}$
- In 1898, the church decided to meet twice per month.

- On May 1, 1921, a meeting was called to rebuild the church after the tornado. In July of 1921, a \$2,000 note was issued for rebuilding costs.
- The new building was dedicated debt-free in 1924.
- In April of 1925, pews were purchased for \$700 from the First Christian Church of Sherman.
- Weekly worship services began August 15, 1948.
- In 1950, a new of building improvements were completed, including re-papering, repainting, carpet added, piano purchased.
- Name of the church was changed in June, 1952, to First Baptist Church Melissa.








Our church's first building was destroyed in the 1921 tornado. This second building was words of constructed in 1924.

- In 1977, major structural improvements included a new peaked roof built over existing flat roof, stucco exterior, new foyer, new choir loft, repainting inside and out, new carpet, paneling, and folding door panels. Cost was \$49,000.
- In 1998, the church votes to relocate. Land search committee formed. Land identified and secured in December, located at intersection of SH 121 and FM 545 in Melissa. Land was purchased for \$214,000.
- On February 28, 1999, a special worship service was held on the new property, led by Pastor Morgan Malone.







Jeremiah 29



Now these are the words of the letter which Jeremiah the prophet sent from Jerusalem to the rest of the elders of the exile, the priests, the prophets and all the people whom Nebuchadnezzar had taken into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon. (This was after King Jeconiah and the queen mother [Nehushta], the court officials, the princes of Judah and Jerusalem, the craftsmen and the smiths had departed from Jerusalem.) Jeremiah 29:1-2

How did this exile happen?

In the third year of the reign of Jehoiakim

[father of Jeconiah/Jehoiachin] king of Judah, Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon came to Jerusalem and besieged it. The Lord gave Jehoiakim king of Judah into his hand, along with some of the vessels of the house of God; and he brought them to the land of Shinar [modern day Iraq], to the house of his god, and he brought the vessels into the treasury of his god. Daniel 1:1-2 *WORDS OF* The letter was sent by the hand of Elasah the son of Shaphan, and Gemariah the son of Hilkiah, whom Zedekiah king of Judah sent to Babylon to Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon, saying... Jeremiah 29:3

Who were the recipients? (see Jeremiah 29:1)

Jeremiah the prophet sent a letter from Jerusalem to "the rest of the elders of the exile, the priests, the prophets and all the people taken into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon"

(God-fearing people facing a national crisis)

What did God tell His people when they were living in a godless land that they did not recognize?

"Thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel, to all the exiles whom I have sent into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon, 'Build houses and live in them; and plant gardens and eat their produce." Jeremiah 29:4-5

*The people of God are where they are because of God's divine will.

*Instead of hoping for Babylon's quick demise they were encouraged to seek its peace and prosperity. - Bible Knowledge Commentary

Don't Stop Living

Jeremiah 29:6-7

Don't Give Up


"For thus says the Lord, 'When seventy years have been completed for Babylon [see Jeremiah 25:11], I will visit you and fulfill My good word to you, to bring you back to this place [Jerusalem]." Jeremiah 29:10

- *Our sovereign God sees and knows the future even when we don't
- *Lots of spiritual growth can happen during exile
- *Will we wait on the goodness of God?

"'For I know the plans that I have for you,' declares the Lord, 'plans for welfare [שֵׁלוֹם shalom] and not for calamity to give you a future and a hope [תַּקְנָה tikvah]." Jeremiah 29:11

Q: Did the Lord give this promise to the winners/victors/champions/powerful?

A: This promise was given to the exiles/defeated/downtrodden/persecuted.



Q: When do you need to know that God has a plan?

A: When the world seems chaotic and uncertain.

Q: When do you need to know that God will provide for you?

A: When the world faces economic and political crises.

Q: When do you need to know that God knows the future?

A: When the world can't even properly predict tomorrow.

Q: When do you need hope?

A: When the world seems hopeless.



" 'Then [when you are in exile and feel lost and hopeless] you will call upon Me and come and pray to Me, and I will listen to you. You will seek Me and find Me when you search for Me with all your heart. I will be found by you,' declares the Lord, 'and I will restore your fortunes and will gather you from all the nations and from all the places where I have driven you,' declares the Lord, 'and I will bring you back to the place from where I sent you into exile."
